MEMBERSHIP CONDITIONAL (HISTORIC) REGISTRATION

All owners and enthusiasts of Italian cars are welcome to become a member of the Scuderia Italian Car Club Inc. Initial Member / Associate Subscription cost is currently \$125.00. This includes the cost of a Club Shirt, Club Key Ring [membership number], and name badge. In subsequent years, membership/associate fee is currently \$80.00. Family Membership is \$25.00. There is no additional joining fee.

Club membership commences 1st July and ends 30th June. **If your car/s are on Conditional Registration and you have not paid your Club Membership fee [due date 30th June each year], you are driving an unregistered and uninsured car.** Please ensure your membership fee is paid up and your log book is current and stamped with the correct year. **Please note that due to the tightening of State Government requirements, all members requiring Conditional (Historic) registration must have their fees paid and books signed by 30th June.**

Once your car has been granted Conditional Registration, the onus is on the owner of the vehicle to maintain their vehicle in original order and to keep the log book/s up to date.

An annual log book validation (the club organises a day and venue for this) is required. All Members are entitled to register their car/s on Conditional Registration if their pride and joy meets all requirements.

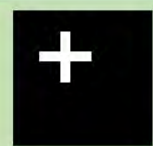

RECIPES

PASTA ALLA NORMA

This is a classic Sicilian dish which features eggplant. This is the Jamie Oliver recipe.

Ingredients

2 eggplants
3 cloves garlic
1/2 bunch of fresh basil (15g)
1 teaspoon dried oregano
olive oil
1 tablespoon baby capers
1 tablespoon red wine vinegar
1 x 400g tin of plum tomatoes
320 g dried spaghetti
50g pecorino cheese
extra virgin olive oil

Method

Chop the eggplants into rough 2cm chunks. Place into a colander in the sink, sprinkle with sea salt to draw out the moisture, then set aside for around 20 minutes.

Peel and finely slice the garlic, then pick the basil leaves and finely slice the stalks.

Rinse the eggplant and pat dry with kitchen paper, then place into a large bowl with the oregano, chilli flakes, a splash of olive oil and a pinch of sea salt and black pepper. Toss together well.

Drizzle a splash of olive oil into a large frying pan over a medium heat. Once hot, add the eggplant in a single layer, and fry for 5 to 8 minutes, or until softened and golden, stirring occasionally – you may need to do this in batches.

Add another splash of olive oil, followed by the garlic, capers and basil stalks, then cook for a further 2 minutes, or until golden.

Stir in the vinegar and the tomatoes, breaking them up with the back of a spoon. Reduce the heat to low, and simmer gently for 15 to 20 minutes, or until thick and glossy.

Cook the spaghetti in a pan of boiling salted water until al dente.

Drain the spaghetti, reserving a cupful of the cooking water, then add a good splash of the reserved water to the eggplant sauce.

Finely grate in half the cheese and tear in most of the reserved basil leaves. Add a lug of extra virgin olive oil, then season to taste.

Add the spaghetti to the sauce and toss well, adding an extra splash of the reserved cooking water to loosen, if needed.

Divide between bowls, grate over the remaining cheese and finish with the remaining basil scattered on top.
